100 Entries Expected

Eighty entries have been received so far for the first annual Central Pennsylvania Festival of Arts 10-Mile Run which will be staged Sunday. The Nittany Valley Track Club is sponsoring the event. It will end at College Ave. and Allen St. in State College about 10:45 a.m.

All finishers will receive a Central Pennsylvania Festival of the Arts T-Shirt.

There will be seven divisions: open, sub-masters, masters, veterans, women's open, women's over-30 and youth (15-and-under.)

"We'll probably have 100 entries by Sunday," Harry Groves of the NVTC said last night. "But this should turn into a great event every year. It's a fun

thing as well as a competitive thing."

Some of the top entries include ex-Penn Staters Charlie Maguire and Greg Fredericks and Penn State graduate student Pete Bortolotti in the open division, Bernie Greene in the 30-39 age group, Earl Baum in the veterans division, and Jeanine Fink in the women's open division.

All competitors are asked to report to College Ave. and Allen St. at 8:45 a.m. for the bus ride to the starting point. The race will start near the National Gypsum Plant in Bellefonte, and the runners will approach State College from Benner Pike and then Houserville Rd. The race will start at 10 a.m. and Groves expects the winning time to be about 45 minutes.
